Building trust strengthens relationships both with God and others. | -Investing time getting to know each other. -Receiving coaching from others. |

| B E I N G | F A I T H | D O I N G | Personal Responsibility Galatians 6:5 Romans 14:12 Matthew 25:14-30 | Responsibility utilizes one's gifts, talents, and abilities, to achieve an agreed upon goal that works for the benefit of others and maintains the integrity of the individual. | -Prioritizing needs over wants. -Developing discipline and accountability to prepare for the future. |

| B E I N G | F A I T H | D O I N G | Teamwork Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 Ephesians 5:21 Corinthians 12:12-14 James 4:7-10 | Teamwork is the collaborative effort of a group of individuals working together towards a common goal, characterized by mutual support, effective communication, and a shared sense of purpose. It involves a willingness to submit to one another, recognizing that each person's contributions and strengths enhance the overall effectiveness of the team. | -Committing to surrender to God and submit to one another. -Embracing the multiplication that happens when teams work together. |

Effective leadership is marked by a commitment to the well-being of others and a focus on fostering collaboration and growth within a team or community. | -Looking to God for direction and sustainability and recognizing without God's wisdom and understanding life is meaningless. -Leading with prayer. |
